SHIPPING DANGEROUS GOODS IS A HAZARDOUS BUSINESS

It is important to know which class your goods are and what quantity limits apply

What are dangerous goods?

Any substance or item which could harm if not handled correctly, and pose a risk to health, safety or the environment

Who is responsible for declaring dangerous goods?

The shipper; fines will be incurred for mislabelling or non declaration of dangerous goods

What you need to do

Notify us of Hazardous Cargo at the point of quotation / booking Provide us with the DGN (Dangerous Goods Note) and MSDS (Material Safety Data Sheet) The DGN must include the following:

Hazardous Class Packing Group UN Number 24 Hour Emergency Contact Number

Different Rules apply depending on your Mode of Transport

DANGEROUS GOODS



Explosive substances & articles

e.g fireworks, flares, ammunition



Flammable Solids Self Reactive substances

e.g matches, sulphur powder, Phosphorus. Substances liable to spontaneous combustion

RADIOACTIVE

e.g smoke detectors



Explosive substances & articles, Flammable Gas

e.g butane. Non-flammable & toxic gases, nitrogen, helium, oxygen, chlorine



Explosive substances & articles

e.g Oxidising substances & Organic Peroxides, fertiliser, hydrogen peroxide, hair dye, fibreglass repair



Corrosive Substances

e.g bleach, citric acid, dishwasher tablets, drain cleaner, battery fluid



Flammable Liquids & Gases

e.g solvents, paints, lighter fluid, varnish, perfumes, printing ink, adhesives



Toxic & Infectious substances

e.g pesticides, chromium salt, blood samples or medical trials



Miscellaneous dangerous substances & articles

e.g lithium batteries, laptops, telephones, magnets, air-bags

The consignor or sender is responsible for classifying, packaging and marking any dangerous goods to be transported, ensuring they comply with international and national regulations for the Transport Mode.

If you are not sure if your shipment should be classified dangerous goods, please either ask the manufacturer or suppler for a MSDS (Material Safety Data Sheet) if it contains a UN number it is dangerous goods, or contact us and we can help.
